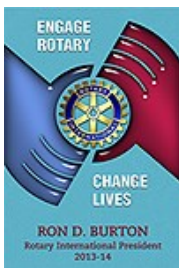

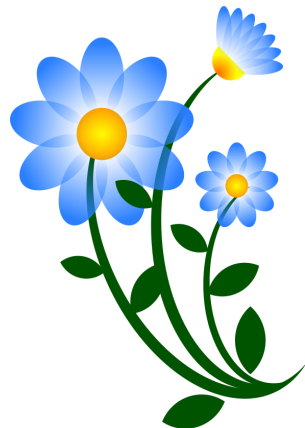

Rookie of the Year

I held my blue-and-white trophy shaped like a dove, symbolizing the RY Theme "Peace thru Service", beaming widely beside IPP Liza Pineda who bestowed the award. It was a proud moment, being named Rookie of the Year, one year after I joined RC Sta. Rosa Centro.

"Rookie" means new recruit, or someone who has been in an organization for a year or less. It fitted me to a T, but I have to admit, had somebody told me one year ago that I will be awarded Rookie of the Year, I would have raised an eyebrow and asked: "what's the big deal"?

Rewind to a year ago. It was March 2012 when I re-joined Centro (I was recruited way back in 2002 but resigned after a few months, but that is another story). I prepared to attend my first meeting, confident that my years of experience rendered me fully equipped to make a significant contribution to the club and its members. I entered the function room at El Cielito Inn and I was warmly welcomed by the members, some of them I still remember from 2002. Soon after, the meeting started, and in less than ten minutes I started to feel dumb and disoriented.

"What are we declaring in our SAR?", somebody asked. "What is your decision, are we doing EREY?", another wanted to know. "Our DRAC is next week, we need the payments within today"... "DG is requesting us to attend"... "What is the update on our matching grant?"...

The room began to spin, and soon after I realized that I had a lot of learning to do.

So I asked around and slowly, I was able to learn the lingo. But that turned out to be the easiest part. Once I asked about protocol, and I was told to download the Manual of Procedures from the RI website. When I looked, it was more than 300 pages long. It turned out that being a true Rotarian does not happen when the club president sticks a pin on your lapel and shakes your hand. It is a long process, where the journey itself is probably more fulfilling than the destination of being given recognitions and awards.

So today I look at my blue-and-white trophy sitting on top of my console table at home, and I feel proud. I have conquered that first step of becoming a Rotarian.

ROTARY BASICS

Good to know :

Club assembly — A meeting to discuss the club's programs and activities. Open to all club members.

District conference — An annual motivational meeting that showcases club and district activities. Open to all Rotarians in that district and their families.

Interact — Service and social clubs for youth ages 12 to 18 that are sponsored by Rotary clubs.

PolioPlus — The Rotary Foundation program focused on global polio eradication efforts.

ProjectLnK — A database at www.rotary.org that lists Rotary service projects needing volunteer or financial assistance. Also highlights model projects from around the world.

Rotaract — Service and social clubs for young adults ages 18 to 30 that are sponsored by Rotary clubs.

Rotarian Action Groups — International groups of individuals who share a passion for a humanitarian issue or service activity. An example is the Water and Sanitation Rotarian Action Group.

Rotary Community Corps — Groups of non-Rotarians who work on service projects for their communities. Organized and sponsored by Rotary clubs.

Rotary Fellowships — International groups of individuals who share a vocational or recreational interest. An example is the International Skiing Fellowship of Rotarians.

Rotary Foundation, the — The philanthropic arm of Rotary International. Helps Rotarians advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through humanitarian projects and educational programs.

Rotary Foundation Board of trustees — The 15 Rotarians who manage the business of The Rotary Foundation, led by the trustee chair. Appointed by the RI president, with agreement from the RI Board, to four-year terms.

Rotary International (RI) — The international association composed of 34,200 Rotary clubs in nearly every country of the world. Headquartered in Evanston, Illinois, USA, with international offices on four continents.

RI Board of directors — The 19 Rotarians who set policy for Rotary International. Elected to two-year terms.

RI Convention — An annual celebration of Rotary and Rotarian accomplishments. Held in a different location around the world each year. Open to all Rotarians and their families.

RI president — The Rotarian who presides over the RI Board. Elected to a one-year term.

Rotary Peace Centers — Programs at several universities around the world that offer advanced degrees and professional certificates in peace and conflict resolution.

Rotary Peace Fellow — A recipient of a Rotary Foundation scholarship for study at one of the Rotary Peace Centers.

Rotary Youth Exchange — A cultural exchange program for youth ages 15 to 19. Exchanges can last from one week to one year.

Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) — Leadership training and recognition activities conducted by Rotary clubs or districts for youth and young adults ages 14 to 30.





ROTARY INTERNATIONAL Updates

*An excerpt from President elect's address at the
2013-2014 RI Convention*

When we realize just what we can achieve in Rotary — when we really engage Rotary — that's when lives change. And, at the end of the day, no matter how many lives you reach out to change, the life that will change the most will be your own.

That's what our theme for 2013-14 is all about: Engage Rotary, Change Lives.

Rotary's had the same number of members for around 15 years now: about 1.2 million. And we talk a lot about how important it is to bring in new members, so that Rotary can grow. But the truth is that we get plenty of new members in Rotary — about 120,000 every year. So why isn't Rotary growing? Because every year, as those 120,000 new members come in the front door, 120,000 members go out the back door. It's like trying to fill up a bathtub without putting in the plug. And it isn't getting us anywhere.

That's why we're committing to see Rotary membership climb to 1.3 million by 2015. That's an absolutely achievable goal — if we can make sure that we don't just bring in new members but also keep the ones we have. We need to make sure that every new member who comes into Rotary engages with Rotary.

And we have to work harder to bring more women, more diversity, and every age group into Rotary — not just attracting them to Rotary, but making sure Rotary works for them in the long term. Whether that means being more flexible with our schedules and locations or bringing families into our service or even welcoming kids at our meetings — we need to look at all the options, with open eyes, to find the answers that work.

Every Rotarian is different. We all came to Rotary for our own reasons. Sometimes, the reason you joined Rotary isn't the reason you stay. But every one of us here has had that experience of finding the thing in Rotary that has helped us make the transition from just being a member of a Rotary club to being a Rotarian.

And whatever it is to you, however you got that feeling that made you a Rotarian for life, that's what I want you to share — what I want you to help other people discover, so that they can find that feeling for themselves.

The one thing we can't do is say we aren't willing to change. Because if we don't want Rotary to end with us, we can't act like it already does.

Description

THE FACE OF ROTARY is a six-month long photo contest that will culminate in a photo exhibit from 23-28 February 2014 in SM Sta. Rosa, City of Santa Rosa, Laguna.

- ⇒ The contest is about capturing the FACE of Rotary in a project of any Rotary club in District 3820 encompassing the following places: Laguna, Batangas, Quezon, Mindoro Oriental, Marinduque, Masbate, and the Bicol region.
- ⇒ The contest's theme is "Changing Lives" so photo entries must carry this message.
- ⇒ Each photo entry must be sponsored by any Rotary club from District 3820.
- ⇒ A Rotary club can submit as many entries as it wants.
- ⇒ A Rotary club may sponsor as many photographers as it wants.
- ⇒ 20 photographs will be chosen as finalists and will comprise the exhibit.
- ⇒ The top three winners will be chosen from these 20 photo finalists.
- ⇒ A Popular Choice Award will be given based on votes in THE FACE OF ROTARY facebook.

Must be at least 18 years of age and sponsored by any Rotary club of District 3820 (Laguna, Batangas, Quezon, Mindoro Oriental, Marinduque, Masbate, and the Bicol region)

For your Information

Old-Fashioned Lettuce Salad recipe

A simple and classic salad recipe as easy to whip up as it is delicious. Serve as a starter to your next holiday meal and enjoy the simple beauty of wedged iceberg lettuce and creamy, savory dressing.

- 1/2 c. light cream
- 1 tsp granulated sugar
- 1/4 c. vinegar
- 1/4 tsp salt
