Dear Centro Ladies,

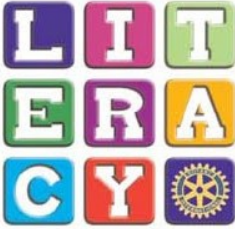

ROTARY CORNER

1 **Decide where your club wants to be in three to five years.**

Your club includes an array of community leaders who share a passion to make a positive impact. Together, decide what you want your club to be like in three to five years. Then determine what you need to do to attain your club's vision. Your long-range goals should address your club's membership, service projects, public image, leadership development, and involvement in The Rotary Foundation. Update your strategic plan as needed, and determine how all club members can contribute to achieving long-range goals.



Ideas to try

- Devote a month of club meetings to developing a strategic plan using the Strategic Planning Guide.
- Hold a club meeting in a new location to inspire members to be creative and voice their opinions.
- Develop a strategy for increasing member engagement over the next five years.

2 **Set annual goals and enter them into Rotary Club Central.**

Once you set your long-range goals, you'll need to set annual goals that support them. Be sure your goals are achievable and measurable. Annual goals can be entered into Rotary Club Central, where they can be tracked and updated. Encourage all club members to view your club's goals in Rotary Club Central and provide input. Update your goals regularly so Rotary Club Central always shows the most current information.



Ideas to try

- Focus on something your club is good at and make it something you're great at.
- Ask club committees to propose annual goals that address community needs.
- Have a goal check-in on your meeting agenda once a month to update members.

President's Message August 2015

In the 1930s, Ole Kirk Christiansen, a Danish carpenter, had a wooden sign hanging on his wall that read, Det bedste er ikke for godt: "Only the best is good enough." Today, Christiansen is remembered as the inventor of Lego, the colorful plastic bricks beloved by children around the world. But in the early days of the Lego company, its signature product was a wooden duck – one built to the highest standards, out of aged beech, with three coats of clear varnish. Lego's company history tells how Christiansen used his ducks to teach a lesson in quality to his son, Godtfred Kirk:



[One evening, when I came into the office, I said to my father: "It's been a good day today, Dad. We've earned a little more." "Oh," said Dad, "what do you mean?" "Well, I've just been to the station with two boxes of our toy ducks for the Danish Co op. Normally they get three coats of varnish, but since it's for the Co-op, I only gave them two. So I saved the business a bit of money." He looked at me in dismay. "Godtfred, fetch those boxes back. Unpack them and give the ducks another coat of varnish. You're not going to bed until the work's done – and you'll do it all on your own." There was no arguing with Dad. And it was a lesson for me about what quality meant.

Today, Lego's quality standards are legendary, and its products are the most popular toys in the world: Lego pieces outnumber humans 86 to 1.

We all recognize that this success stems directly from Lego's business practices – its insistence on quality, efficiency, and innovation. I compare this with our efforts in governance and accountability in Rotary, and realize that sometimes we fall short of the standards expected.

The leaders at the Rotary International, zone, district, and club levels have to maintain the highest standards in governance. The RI president and directors must serve the membership in a meaningful manner; zone leaders must deliver on the investment Rotary makes in them; district leaders must provide dynamic leadership in the district and focus on transparency in accounting and timely reporting of financials; and club leaders must adhere to proper reporting functions and get their clubs onto Rotary Club Central.

Just as Christiansen refused to consider sending a lesser product to any of his clients, so should we refuse to consider giving a lesser effort to any of our work. We must always demand the best of ourselves – in our professional lives, and especially in our Rotary work.

For in Rotary, what is our product? It is not wooden ducks or plastic bricks. It is education, water, health, and peace. It is hope, and it is life itself. For this work, only our best is good enough. I ask you all to remember this – and to do your very best to Be a Gift to the World.

A letter from Leire Lopez



Hi, My name is Leire.

In my free time, I like hanging out with my friends, watching films (my favorite ones are romantic comedies), and of course, going shopping.

I love listening to music at the same time I dance, although I'm not very good at it. Reading, eating out with my family, visiting my grandparents and taking a nap (when I have some time) are also some of my hobbies. I am really interested in the fashion industry.

I study ten subjects at high school (Social Sciences, Geography and History, English, Biology and Geology, Physics and Chemistry, Citizenship (in English), Spanish Language and Literature, Maths, English, French and Religious Education. Each lesson takes around 55 minutes with five minutes break between them.

My timetable is from 8:15 am to 2:15pm. We have 6 classes a day and a break of half an hour. I get on very well with my classmates, even some have become my closest friends.

We are very few students in my class, but as we have good partnership, teachers complain because we are very talkative.

Daily Life

I get up at 7:15am, I choose my clothes (I don't wear uniform), take a shower, make my breakfast and leave home about 8:05. My house is five0minute walk from school. When I arrive, I get into the class and chat with my partners for a while until the teacher comes. There are three fifty-five minute lessons until break time at 11. In this moment, we have a snack and come back to class at 11.30. Then we have three more lesson till we finish. I walk back home with my brother and a friend of mine. We three, my mother, my brother and me have lunch together. As my father works away, he isn't.

In the afternoon, we rest for a short time, then we have to study, do homework and go to extra lessons. About 9.30 we have dinner, we usually watch TV and go to bed around 11.

At school, we do a lot of extra activities, such as soccer and basket leagues, although I don't take part in them because I am not keen on sports. We also do some performances with charitable purposes. Every year we do a different musical where teachers and students act. Last year, I played the role of supporting actress in "Nightmare before Christmas". I like acting though I'm not good in singing.

In the afternoons, I go to extra lessons of English, Maths and I swim. I've

played the saxophone once a week since I was none and studied Music Theory since 4. I also play and rehearse in the local band. This activity takes a lot of my time because I do it at least three or four days a week, for two hours each.

I live in a three-floor house. The garage, the living-room, the kitchen and a small bath-

room are in the ground floor. In the first floor there are three bedrooms and a bathroom. I have a bedroom for my own. Here I study, read and listen to music. There is an attic and a small toilet in the top floor. This is the place where guests sleep.

My house is near the medical center and the high school, and it takes five minutes to walk to the city center.

I live in a town of around 14,000 inhabitants. Its economy is based on the agriculture and industry. There is an industrial park where there are important factories. My town is one hour drive from Madrid, the capital city of Spain.

My mom works in a local kinder garden and my father is in charge of the security system of big companies.

I really like Art, I try to visit museums. I think they are very interesting. My favorite technique is Pop-Art.

I haven't travelled abroad much. I was in one week exchange in France and in Andorra skiing with my classmates.

I'm not very organized. I don't like vegetable soup or spinach. I don't like running either. I dislike horror films and I'm afraid of big dogs.

My worst features are that I'm a bit messy, and absent-minded. And my best, I'm very easy going and responsible.

In the future, I would like to become a doctor, forensic surgeon, although I know it's very difficult because in my country if you want to study this degree, you must have very high marks. Other thing I'd like to get is to be able to speak English fluently. I know it is very important for my future.

I want to transmit the culture of my country and region, I want to learn to get used to new experiences and make new friends.

When I come back. I'll continue my studies but with the advantage I'll have been able to learn a new language. I would also like to keep in contact with the people and family I'll have known during my stay in another country.

I will tell other students about my exchange experience and I hope it to be good.

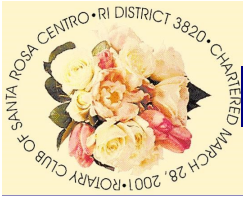
