



Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) is a leadership program coordinated by Rotary Clubs around the globe. Each year, thousands of young people participate in this program. Young people ages 14–30 are sponsored by Rotary Clubs to attend the event run by the club's district committee. Participants are chosen for their leadership potential.

Attracting Younger Professionals to Rotary Club- Part 1

90 percent of Rotary members worldwide are age 40 and older. This is a staggering statistic and one that we can't take lightly. Anyone who has been involved with Rotary has such passion for the organization. We need to determine how to leverage that passion to the next generation.

Rotary International regularly conducts research with non-members and members including women, younger professionals, retirees, and alumni.

From 2007 through 2012, in person focus groups were conducted in Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, France, Indonesia, Japan, South Africa, Sweden, and the United States. Research was also conducted worldwide through web-based group discussions.

Non-member focus groups were conducted by external vendors such as Ipsos, Japan Market Intelligence, and Focuscope.

Most recently, thanks to a generous gift by two Past District Governors, the Young Professionals Campaign was created to find out how Rotary can better engage and attract younger professionals. As part of their work, the team conducted several focus groups in small, medium, and large markets.

Additional support for the following conclusions and recommendations come from tightly-managed surveys of new, veteran and resigned members as well as other members of the Family of Rotary such as program alumni.

Further support for the best practices presented in this session have been and are currently being tested and proven by more than 1500 clubs through 7 membership pilot programs.

CONNECT FOR GOOD

During the focus groups, the participants discussed the following topics:

Levels of awareness, Perception, and image of Rotary.

Perception of membership value propositions such as volunteering, service, and networking.

Attractiveness of membership and barriers to membership and how to improve potential and current members' experiences

First, we learned that it's important for clubs to change their culture because a more inviting and inclusive club culture translates into more members. Clubs need to look at themselves and determine how welcoming they are to younger professionals.

As one focus group participant in Appleton, Wisconsin aptly put it, "Don't tell me what you're not." It is an ineffective use of social media and other public outreach to tell the community that your club is a vibrant group of hands-on service providers, if guests experience something different in reality.

Also, it's critical that clubs focus on retaining members by mentoring new members. It takes five times the amount of effort to replace a member than to retain one. It is necessary to build a solid relationship with the prospective member before they join so the club meets their expectations.

One thing a club can do now is to open up your service projects to

non-members and prospects. We've had a very positive experience with that approach and it's easy to do as we've shown by using social media—no hard costs involved!

II. TOPICS DISCUSSED:

Included in the schedule is the discussion of the proposed joint project on anti-cervical cancer vaccine. Pres. Arlene will check supplier/s for the vaccine.
 New Generation Vice-Chairman/PN Evs advised that the orientation for the proposed Rotaract club members will not proceed on September 13, 2014 to give way to the scheduled Farewell Party for RC Wodonga West. She informed also that the orientation for the District MUNA participants will be held on September 13, 2014 in Lucena City from 1PM to 5PM.
 Community Projects Chairman PE Pen gave updates on the following undertakings:

3.1 Spelling Bee

Dir. Myrna to prepare the letter of invitation to schools then PE Pen to take charge in the distribution of the letters.

3.2 Citronella/Neem Tree Planting

PE Pen to prepare the mechanics and to compute also as to how many/how much plants will be needed for the project.

3.3. Basura-Free Contest

The project is complicated and was decided to be cancelled as recommended by Pres. Arlene.

3.4 Livelihood Project (Vegetable Garden)

PDG Chit recommended organic farming and will re-send the article on farming for the club's review.

4. Our club induction is moved to October 27, 2014 at Bellevue Hotel in Alabang City. Governor's Visit will be in the morning of October 27, 2014 in Alabang City also (exact venue still to be sourced).

5. Bazaar Project on November 18-19, 2014

As per PP Carol, Pres. Arlene preferred the Filinvest Tent as the venue for our fund raiser. However, PDG Chit suggested not to pursue the project if the required letter of intent to Filinvest has not yet been prepared due to time constriction. Rtn. Michelle to check the letter.

6. Blocked screening of the movie "The Hobbit" will be on December 2014. It will become a joint fund raising project between the Leon C. Arcillas Foundation and RC Sta. Rosa Centro. Pres. Arlene agreed to a 70%-30% sharing of profit.

7. Souvenir Program as another club fund raiser will be during the hosting of the District Recognition and Awarding Ceremony (DRAC) on May 2015.

8. PP Jackie recommended two (2) DARE activities as another community project. One is a 3-month lecture/activities which will start on October, beneficiaries will be the Grade 5 pupils of Central 2. Another one is a 1-day Symposium on Drug Awareness. Both are to be handled by the Sta. Rosa PNP. However, PDG Chit still to check on how to give more impact on the project.

9. PDG Chit proposed another project – a Basketball Clinic by Coach Eric Altamirano. She will get the mechanics and will be emailed to the group.

Note on Items #8 and #9 : Breakdown of expenses to be submitted to Pres. Arlene so she can decide which project to do.


10. Other Matters:

The Philippine Stock Exchange (PSE) is the corporation that governs our local stock market. People buy or invest in stocks to benefit from a company's tremendous value potential over time.

Once you buy or invest into a stock you now become part owner or a shareholder of that particular corporation.

How to make money in stocks?

As a Shareholder, you can now participate in the company's growth and success through stock Price Appreciation and by earnings Dividends.

Capital or price appreciation is an increase in the market price of your stock over time brought about by an increase in its potential value and the demand to buy its shares. The faster a company can grow, the faster its price can appreciate.

Profitable corporations can also issue dividends, whether in cash or in additional shares of stock as a means for shareholders to share in their distributed profits.

Why Invest in the Stock Market?

History has proven that investing in quality stocks can provide greater returns than most investment instruments. This offers you the best chance in achieving your financial goals and gives you the ability to later enjoy the benefits of your money working for you.

The track record of the stock market also shows that a good basket of stocks climb more often than decline - reducing risk over the long-term. Once you buy or invest into a stock you now become part owner or a shareholder of that particular corporation.






