

Birth of the Rotary's FOUR-WAY TEST

There are several ways to describe what Rotary is all about. One is the slogan that we use, "Service Above Self . . . He Profits Most Who Serves Best". That is certainly a high and noble ideal that has lifted many a man or woman out of themselves and set their vision on the heights.

Another ideal around the world is "The Four-Way Test" and it is one of the most famous statements of our Century. Like most things worthwhile, it came into existence because of one man.

Great things are not normally accomplished by a committee. Most things of value in this world have been done because of a special person. Great things are done by human beings, who are committed to a cause.

I want to tell you about The Four Way Test and Herbert J. Taylor, a man of action, faith, and high moral principle. Born in Michigan, he married in 1919 and moved to Oklahoma where he worked for the Sinclair Oil Company. After a year, he resigned and went into Insurance, Real Estate, and Oil Lease Brokerage. He was a mover, a doer, a consummate salesman, and a leader of men.

With some prosperous years behind him, Herb returned to Chicago in 1925 and began a swift rise within the old Jewel Tea Company. In line for the presidency of Jewel in 1932, he was asked to help revive the near-bankrupt Club Aluminum Company. Looking for a way to resuscitate the company, caught in the great depression, Herb prayed (he was a deeply religious man) for a short measuring stick of ethics, the staff could use.

Herb had a little black book where he jotted down things he wanted to remember. As he thought about an ethical measuring stick for the company, he first wrote a statement of about 100 words and decided that was too long. He continued to work, reducing it to seven points. Yes . . .the Four Way Test was once the Seven Way Test. It was still too long and he finally reduced it to the four searching questions, which comprise the test today.

There was a man . . . Herbert J. Taylor and now there was The Four-Way Test.

- Is it the TRUTH?
- Is it FAIR to all Concerned?
- Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

Simply written, yet it is as profound as it is simple. The words became the basis for decisions, large and small, at Club Aluminum.

Pope Francis: 10 things you didn't know

1. Jorge Mario Bergoglio was born Dec 17, 1936, in Buenos Aires, Argentina, one of five children born to an Italian railway worker and his wife.

- 2. He speaks Italian, German and Spanish fluently, in addition to a smattering of English, French and Portuguese. He can also speak a bit of the Piedmontaise dialect too.
- 3. He lost part of his lung to infection as a youth.
- 4. He is a fan of the tango. "I love tango and I used to dance when I was young," he told Francesca Ambrogetti and Sergio Rubin, the authors of his 2010 biography El Jesuita.
- 5. He had a girlfriend. "She was one of a group of friends I went dancing with. But then I discovered my religious vocation," he said to Ambrogetti and Rubin.
- 6. He worked as a bouncer in a Buenos Aires bar to earn money as a student.
- 7. He is a passionate fan of San Lorenzo Football Club, his local team. They were the first Argentine team to win the domestic double, in 1972.
- 8. He studied philosophy at the Catholic University of Buenos Aires and also has a master's degree in Chemistry from the University of Buenos Aires.
- 9. He is the co-author of "Sobre el Cielo y la Tierra (On Heaven and Earth)", which can be purchased in Kindle.
- 10. He used public transport rather than taxis or a chauffeured car to get around and lived in a small flat with an older priest and made all his own meals, despite having access to the Archbishop's quarters and a chef.



Minutes of the Assembly:

- A team-building session was held from 7:45 to 9 p.m., administered by Mr. Angel Lozari, after which the club awarded Mr. Lozari with a plague of appreciation and a simple token.
- The club assembly was called to order by PhP Liza at about 9:15 p.m.
- 3. Committee Reports followed:
 - a. International by PDG Chit:
 - Mayor Arlene's tasks are to connect our club with a town in Sweden and find a Rotary connection in Japan as possible sister club or project partner.
 - Regarding RC of Wodonga as sister club issue: the next RI will be in Sydney, so there may be a chance for us to visit them.

 - b. Training by PDG Chit:
 - i. We will inject our training during meetings and in our bulletin.
 - ii. January is Rotary Awareness Month and we can hold a Training Day.

 are encouraged to find sponsors so we will get 15% per ad. PRM circulation is nationwide and
 delivered to doorstep.
 - c. Vocational sub-committee: Maan.
 - Regarding our Scholarship Program, we have some suggested amendments. Further study should be done on this program.
 - We will do one Vocational Tour this RY.
 - d. Service Projects by Rtn Exs:
 - i. We propose to create an RCC Rotary Community Corps.
 - ii. For PE <u>Ogray's</u> kick-off activity, we will give school supplies to School on Wheels at <u>Brgy</u>, <u>Tagapo</u>, The supplies will be donated by PP Ron <u>Sugapong</u> of RC Laguna.
 - July is Disaster Awareness Month. We can participate in the simultaneous Earthquake Drill to be done in different schools.
 - iv. Coastal Clean Up last year we held it on July 10. For Rotary, the schedule is every September. The Club may or may not participate in the City's coastal clean-up, or just send a representative.
 - v. Buntis Wellness To be held in March 2014, Women's Month, at the same venue.
 - vi. Dugo Mo Sagip Buhay Ko Blood Letting Project. This project should be studied more before implementation i.e., each member get donors or do it at a site like a company or school. This is one of the thrusts of our new Governor.
 - vii. Water Hyacinth Livelihood Project for three barangays. We can apply for a matching grant for this.
 - e. Club Admin by Rtn Pen
 - i. Meetings
 - We will have two Board meetings this year, scheduled on June 28, 2013 and January 31, 2014.
 - Our Governor's Visit is scheduled on September 6, 2013.
 - Our 2nd Club Assembly will be on November 9, 2013.
 - Our Club Elections will be on December 16, 2013.
 - ii. Attendance : PP Precy
 - Reminder to all members: please improve your attendance, because this reflects on our Club's performance.
 - We are targeting to keep absences to only 20%.
 - 3. Suggestions to improve our attendance:
 - a. PP Zeny: We can ask the members to take turns and make a 5-minute talk during meetings.
 - b. PP Zeny: We can have a monthly auction, and proceeds can go to our Club
 - c. We can have a Perfect Attendance reward.
