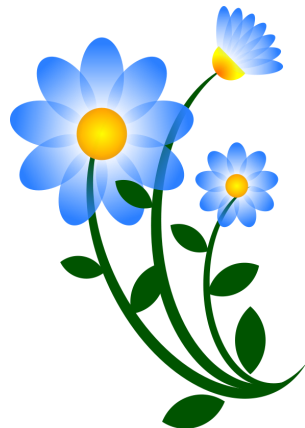

Dear fellow Rotarians,

A Rotary convention is a powerful thing, and a first convention is an experience you never forget. My first was in Chicago, in 1980. That was the year I was president of the Rotary Club of Yashio. I thought we should learn more about Rotary, so I asked nine other members of my club to join me, and we traveled to Chicago together. We did not know what to expect from a Rotary convention. What we found was more than any of us had imagined.

That convention showed me Rotary, and changed me forever. It gave our club something to strive for. I came to that convention as a member of a Rotary club. I left it as a Rotarian. The feeling that entered my heart in Chicago is still there today.

I am glad I will have the opportunity, as an RI president from Japan, to be part of the convention in Portugal. Portugal and Japan have a history together that began in the year 1542. This was the year that a Portuguese boat landed on a southern Japanese island. The Portuguese sailors did not plan to come to Japan. Strong winds blew their boat off course. But it was a happy accident, and the beginning of a peaceful and prosperous relationship.

In 1993, Japan and Portugal celebrated 450 years of good relations. Portugal was the first European country visited by the Japanese, in the middle of the 16th century. And the long Portuguese presence in Japan has had a lasting effect on my country.

The Portuguese found Japan by accident. But it is no accident that Lisbon has been chosen for this convention. Lisbon is A Harbor for Peace. And peace is the theme of this convention, as it has been the theme between Japan and Portugal for nearly 500 years.

As Rotarians, we work toward peace in many ways. We do it through humanitarian service. We do it through our belief in Service Above Self. And we work toward peace simply by being who we are. Every year, when we come together for a Rotary convention, we see, for a few days, the world as it could be. We see people of all colors and cultures come together. We work to build a better world.

I hope you will join me, and your fellow Rotarians, as we celebrate this year of *Peace Through Service* together.

Where did our growth come from? (Excerpts)

Now it's official: the Philippines is the fastest-growing economy in Asia. Beating China's first quarter growth (7.7 percent) by a hair, our 7.8-percent growth in gross domestic product (GDP) was proudly homegrown, achieved in the face of a hefty drop (-7 percent) in exports. This implies that domestic demand for our economy's goods and services grew at such a rapid pace that not only did it offset the export decline; it even pushed overall growth to what many see as an unusually high rate.

There is something both usual and unusual about our first quarter growth. On one hand, such extraordinary growth is not so unusual for an election year. Recently, I noted how election years have seen growth exceed the average for nonelection years by 2-3 percentage points ("Elections and the economy," Inquirer, 5/14/13). This is because massive election spending by both candidates and government has a strong stimulative effect on the economy. In fact, our economy actually grew by an even faster 8.4 percent in the first quarter (and 8.9 percent in the second quarter) in the previous election year of 2010. With this, one would think that our recent growth was not such a mean feat after all.

But it is. Even with the above observations, there is still something unusual and impressive about our first quarter growth. Consider this: the Q1-2010 growth of 8.4 percent followed Q1-2009 growth of a mere 0.5 percent. This means that growth in Q1-2010 was built on a relatively low base, making it easier to post a higher percentage growth at the time. This is the so-called "base effect," which can go the other way around when the past year's growth is strong. Note, however, that we achieved 7.8-percent growth in Q1-2013 even as growth in Q1-2012 was a brisk 6.5 percent. This makes our recent growth even more impressive as it was built on a normal if not relatively higher base. Economic Planning Secretary Arsenio Balisacan was thus justifiably proud in dismissing doubts on the past year's already impressive growth rates as "being due to base effects only." The numbers clearly suggest otherwise, and that the economy is sustaining robust growth with vigor coming from within, at least so far.

RC Sta. Rosa Centro CLUB ASSEMBLY Part II

31 May 2013

El Cielito Inn, Sta. Rosa City

1. Club Secretary Che Lu called the Club Assembly Part II to order at 7:55 p.m.
2. After the Prayer, National Anthem and Acknowledgements, PP Precy recognized two members namely, Rtn. Cecile Gabatan for coming out 9th among more than two thousand examinees of the Real Estate Brokers exam, and Rtn. Evs Laranga for receiving the Women of Excellence Award given by CSDWD and Environmental Champion of the Year given by the City of Sta. Rosa.
3. PE Doray presented a report about District Goals vs. our club's goals:
 - a. Under Vocational Awareness:
 - i. We need to promote awareness of the Four-Way test.
 1. PP Carol suggested that we rehabilitate an existing marker we have.
 2. Rtn Evs said that we can ask the children of School on Wheels to sing our "Sweet Rotary" song when we distribute the school supplies.
 - b. Under Youth:
 - i. PE Doray inquired about our Rotaract at PNPA.
 1. Rtn Evs: It is very difficult to maintain a Rotaract there because their Director keeps changing. When I explain Rotaract to the Director, by the time we are ready to implement, they have a new Director again.
 - ii. Rtn Evs suggested that we try to create a community-based Rotaract instead.
 1. We can tap Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) of Brgy. Dila
 - iii. It was agreed that the Youth Committee meet separately to plan for this new Rotaract and make a report to the club later.
 - iv. Regarding Interact, it was reminded that we need to report our Interact's new officers every year or we will be delisted from RI.
 - v. For RYLA, we are encouraged to host or organize a local RYLA by Group. Local Group RYLA is organized by the Group AG.
 - c. For District's Public Image:
 - i. Our District can apply for \$15,000 from RI Public Image Grant. A club or clubs can make one big PR project that will benefit the whole District. It should be a high-impact project.
 1. There is a suggestion to create an AVP of the Philippine National Anthem featuring Rotary in action.
 - d. Under International:
 - i. District to District Friendship Exchange
 1. We should participate in District Rotary Friendship Exchange Project.

- e. Regarding Finance Committee:
- i. PDG Chit was asked to clarify about the function of the Finance Committee. The following functions were named:
 1. At the start of the Rotary Year, create the Club's Budget
 - a. Determine projected income
 - b. Determine projected expenses
 - c. Determine amount the club needs to raise
 - d. Example:

i. Balance from previous year	5,000
ii. Add: Projected income (dues)	50,000
iii. Less: Projected expenses	
1. Admin Expense	20,000
2. Project 1	10,000
3. Project 2	5,000
4. Project 3	15,000
5. Project 4	20,000
6. Project 5	25,000
7. Sub Total	95,000
iv. Total	(40,000)
 - e. Therefore we need to raise 40K
 2. Give report to the Club to determine where and how we can raise needed funds.
 - a. Ex.: Review dues – if we will not do EREY, can we consider increasing our dues by 100 pesos (700)? Maybe the 100 pesos can fund our projects?
 3. To clarify, funds will still be released by Treasurer.
 4. PP Liza added that the Finance Committee will also be in charge of submitting our club's annual report to BIR every end of the year.
 - f. On TRF:
 - i. Should we continue EREY or not?
 1. No final decision was made yet.
 - g. For District Special Projects, our counterpart projects are:
 - i. Buntis Wellness – with our partners PhilHealth, Wyeth, Mead Johnson
 1. PE Doray asked if we could include free newborn screening? It costs 600 pesos each.
 - ii. Water Hyacinth Project – with our partners Brgy. Tagapo, Interactors, Bread Talk (CCF Church) and Bantay-Lawa
 1. PDG Chit asked if we should gear the Water Hyacinth project to women only, so that we will be consistent with our Club's mission? Can we reconsider and vote on it next week?
 - iii. Rtn Evs asked about our District's involvement in Polio Eradication
 1. PDG Chit said none, because it is not so relevant in the Philippines because polio is not so endemic here; but it is the main project of RI.

4. Treasurer's Report
 - a. Breakdown of our club dues and expenses was detailed by PP Jackie.
 - b. PP Jackie also reported on past due of some members. PDG Chit suggested that we consider an "easy payment plan" to settle past dues.
 - c. PP Precy made a report regarding our club's Special fund.
 - d. PDG Chit suggested that we do not include the details of our Treasurer's report in our Minutes. All members agreed.
5. The club discussed the Service projects presented by Rtn Evs during the Club Assembly Part I.
 - a. Haplos ng Rotarian sa Community – objective is to adopt a marginalized sector of the community, to cover 6 areas in Brgy. Tagapo. Venue will be the covered court at Brgy. Tagapo.
 - i. Establish RCC, focusing on Water Hyacinth.
 - ii. School on Wheels – tutorials
 1. Idea is to fully serve them, not as "front" only. Interact with children plus their parents. There are 115 students from different areas in Brgy. Tagapo.
 2. Kick-off of this project will be on July 1, coinciding with Doray's kick-off.
 3. Pres. Liza commented that July 1 is a Monday, can we move it to a weekend?
 - a. It was agreed that the kick-off project will be moved to June 30, Sunday.
 - b. Attendees will wear yellow shirt.
 - c. Bread Talk will give free bread, so we will shoulder drinks. PP Doray volunteered to take care of it.
 - iii. Ugnayang Rotarian, Unlad ng Mamamayan – name of our proposed RCC (Water Hyacinth project)
 1. Rtn Evs: I attended trainers' training last May 25, the members of our RCC could be the trainers who attended. Costs will be shouldered by Brgy. Capt. Marietta of Tagapo.
 2. Needed fund is 5k-10K for looming machine
 3. Rtn. Myrna asked if RCC is the same as Adopt-A-Barangay?
 - a. PDG Chit explained that RCC is different; it is a big project that needs commitment over a long period of time.
 - iv. Adopt-a-Barangay – Proposed title is "Haplos ng Rotarian sa Community", with theme "Responsibilidad ng Rotarian para sa Rosenian".
 1. We can adopt Brgy. Tagapo
 - a. PP Jackie commented that Tagapo is a rich barangay.
 - b. Rtn. Evs said that there are some areas in Tagapo that are still considered poor like Daang NIA. Although we can also consider Brgy. Pagayo.

- c. PDG Chit said that PR Committee should have a separate meeting to come up with appropriate titles to string all community projects under a common theme or name.
 - d. Rtn Evs asked if we can come up with the needed 5K fund? PDG Chit said we need to refer to the Finance Committee.
 - v. Tutorial Session of Rotarians – for School on Wheels
 1. There will be nine (9) tutorial sessions. One of our members can make a 30-minutes talk to the students.
 2. The students will be the ones to gather to a common area.
 3. If 115 students are too many they can be broken down into smaller groups.
 - 6. Rtn Pen announced that the Admin Committee had a meeting at Paseo to discuss how we can make our meetings more vibrant.
 - a. The members were asked if they are agreeable to include a 5-minute talk of one member per meeting called "Centro Chika 5". Assigned member will talk about anything she wants for 5 minutes.
 - i. It was suggested that a "Best Chika" be voted for the month, who will receive a token.
 - ii. As it was PP Zeny who suggested it, she will be asked to have the honor of being the 1st one to do the Centro Chika 5.
 - 7. Other Matters
 - a. PP Precy reminded about the gifts we gave to Rotex Andrea and McKenzie, she needs to be reimbursed 2,600 pesos.
 - i. Members gathered their contributions and paid PP Precy.
 - b. PP Precy announced YEP Selection on October 5, Saturday at El Cielito Inn. This is an overnight event.
 - c. PP Carol explained about computation of Attendance:
 - i. Before, if some members are abroad, they are removed from the members count, thus increasing our attendance percentage. However, now, no one is abroad so we have to use 24 as our divisor, so our average suffers.
 - ii. It was suggested that we declare some of our members on leave.
 - d. Rtn. Pen announced that she has referred to her husband about her appointment as PN, and the good news is, her husband agreed. Everyone congratulated Rtn Pen, who is now PN Pen.
 - i. As discussed earlier, Rtn Evs will follow PN Pen, to be followed by Rtn Myrna and then Rtn Mel.
 - e. The members are reminded about our fellowship on June 7 in Alabang.
 - 8. There being no other matters to discuss, PBP Liza adjourned the Club Assembly Part II on 10:35 p.m.
