



For your Information

Chicken in 5 ways

Chicken is a beloved—and very versatile—meat. It can be served crunchy, grilled, swimming in sauce, spicy, sour, in a soup, etc. Your choices are almost limitless. Here, we show you at least ten ways to enjoy chicken. Cheers to hearty chicken meals!

Fried Chicken

Prepare the marinade composed of calamansi juice, garlic, salt, and pepper. Leave chicken in the mixture for an hour. Assemble your fried chicken coating, using one dish for each of these: flour, beaten egg, and breadcrumbs. Coat each chicken piece one at a time with flour, then egg, then breadcrumbs. Fry until the coating is golden brown.

Chicken Curry

Saute garlic, onion, and ginger. Add chicken until slightly brown. Add water and potatoes, bring to a boil. Simmer until chicken is tender. Add curry powder and red bell peppers. Add coconut milk and season as desired.

Chicken Tocino

For a delicious and healthy breakfast, you can use boneless chicken parts for this recipe. Mix garlic, brown sugar, pineapple juice, soy sauce, salt, and pepper for the marinade. Leave chicken in the mixture for at least 1 hour. Then you can either fry or bake the chicken pieces until tender.

Chicken Inasal

Grind together garlic, ginger, lemongrass, yellow ginger, salt, pepper, and annatto powder. Rub the paste all over the chicken pieces. Put the chicken in one layer in a big container and pour just enough vinegar to cover all the pieces. Marinate for 3 hours. Grill over hot coals.

Chicken Barbecue

This picnic favorite is best prepared the night before a gathering. For at least an hour, marinate chicken pieces in soy sauce, calamansi juice, garlic, onions, sprite or 7-up, sugar, and pepper. Grill over hot coals.

II. PROGRAM PROPER

- The meeting was called to order at 8:10PM by Pres. Liza. It was followed by the Invocation led by Rtn. Cecile; the National Anthem by Rtn. Myrna; the Four Way Test by PE Doray; and recitation of the Object of Rotary by PP Carol.
- 2. PP Precy recognized Pres. Liza due to the following accounts:
 - conducted a school supplies donation project at <u>Pagoyo</u> Day Care Center up to the last minute of her term (June 14, 2013);
 - 2.2 for being one of the Outstanding Presidents and Centro as one of the Outstanding Clubs during the recently concluded DRAC (June 8, 2013); and
 - 2.3 for the different recognitions and awards received by the club and other Centro Ladies.

3. Topics Discussed:

- 3.1 Pres. Liza reported that an abrupt School Supplies Donation project was conducted that day (June 14, 2013) at the RC Sta. Rosa Centro adopted Pagoyo Day Care Center. The activity was in partnership with JTPSI Employees' Cooperative; and was attended by Pres. Liza, PE Doray, Rtn. Evs and Rtn. Gloria. Donated items for the 45 students were 4 pcs. Notebook, 1 pad paper, 2 pcs. pencils, 2 bxs crayons (8's) and 1 pair of scissors c/o JTPSI Coop while Centro donated 1 unit Wall Fan and snacks for the students (from the PE's fund).
- 3.2 PE <u>Doray</u> announced her kick-off project, a School Supplies Donation also, will be held on June 30, 2013 at 10:00 AM. The venue will be the <u>Bray</u>. <u>Jagapo</u> Basketball Covered Court. Recipients are the 115 students of the School <u>On</u> Wheels (SOW).

After hearing the comparison, Centro Ladies present voted to continue (YES) with EREY, and Voluntary only to Sustaining.
