
OBJECT OF ROTARY

Rotary recognizes Prime Minister Trudeau for Canada's commitment to ending polio



Canada has been a champion in the fight to eradicate polio since 1986, when it became the first government to formally fund global polio immunization efforts. Canada has pro-

vided over CAD \$750 million in support of a polio-free world, including a \$100 million pledge to global eradication in 2017. Earlier this month, Canada, as host of the G7 summit, was joined by G7 leaders in affirming a commitment to polio eradication.

"Prime Minister Trudeau has committed Canada to remain a strong partner until polio is completely eradicated," said Rotary International President Ian H.S. Riseley. "With the unwavering support of the Prime Minister and the Canadian government and their strong assistance with continued vaccination efforts, I'm confident we will rid the world of polio."

Later this week, Rotary will announce nearly \$50.12 million in support for global polio eradication efforts in countries where polio is a threat. Since 1988, Rotary has contributed more than \$2.3 billion and countless volunteer hours in the fight to end polio, with Rotary clubs in Canada donating more than \$66.6 million towards polio eradication. Rotary members throughout Canada travel regularly to polio-threatened countries to vaccinate children in mass immunization campaigns.

To help create awareness and support for the global effort to protect all children from polio, Rotary's international convention will feature two virtual reality videos that will immerse viewers into the lives of those still impacted by the disease, and what it will take to eradicate it worldwide. Download the Rotary VR app in Google Play or the Apple App Store to view "I Dream of an Empty Ward."

Polio eradication has been Rotary's top priority since 1985. In 1988, Rotary became a leading partner in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, along with the World Health Organization, UNICEF, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and later, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. Since the initiative launched, the incidence of polio has plummeted by more than 99.9 percent, from about 350,000 cases in 1988 to just 22 confirmed cases in two countries in 2017.

Let's make it easier to make adjustments in our clubs or start new clubs that suit different needs. Let's work to strengthen Rotaract and smooth the transition from Rotaract clubs into Rotary. Let's give all Rotarians the flexibility to serve in the ways that work best for them, so that every Rotarian finds enduring value in Rotary membership.

Truly sustainable service, the kind of service we strive for in Rotary, means looking at everything we do as part of a larger global ecology. This year, I ask all of you to Be the Inspiration for sustainable service by addressing the impact of environmental issues on our work. The environment plays a key role in all six of our areas of focus, and that role is only becoming greater as the impact of climate change unfolds. It's time to move past seeing the environment as somehow separate from those six areas. Clean air, water, and land are essential for healthy communities – and essential for the better, healthier future we strive for.

The HISTORY OF ROTARY



Paul P. Harris, an attorney, wanted to create a professional group with the same friendly spirit he felt in the small towns of his youth.

On 23 February 1905, Harris, Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele, and Hiram Shorey gathered at Loehr's office in Room 711 of the Unity Building in downtown Chicago. This was the

first Rotary club meeting. They decided to call the new club "Rotary" after the practice of rotating meeting locations.

Within five years clubs had formed across the country, from San Francisco to New York.

In August 1910, Rotarians held their first convention in Chicago. The 16 clubs that existed at that time united to form the National Association of Rotary Clubs.

In 1912, the name changed to International Association of Rotary Clubs to reflect the addition of clubs in other countries. The name Rotary International was adopted in 1922.

By July 1925, Rotary had grown to more than 2,000 clubs and an estimated 108,000 members on six continents.

Rotary's reputation attracted presidents, prime ministers, and a host of other luminaries to its ranks — among them author Thomas Mann, diplomat Carlos P. Romulo, and composer Jean Sibelius.

As Rotary grew, members pooled their resources and used their talents to serve their communities. The organization's dedication to this ideal is best expressed in its motto: Service Above Self.

Meet PDG MIKE LIRIO

Assistant Regional Rotary Foundation Coordinator for Zone 7A, Philippines and Indonesia

Since he became a Rotarian 31 years ago, there has not been a day that PDG Mike wavered in his commitment to serve. He poured his time, talent, and treasure into this organization he has grown to love and which has become an integral part of his life.

His innate leadership and burning motivation easily set him apart. After he became the president of his club, the Rotary Club of



Tanauan in RY 1995-96, PDG Mike continued to soar up the leadership ladder of Rotary International. His rise culminated in his holding the helm of District 3820 as its District Governor for the milestone centennial year of 2004-05.

Rotary governors come and go; but a few elect to stay, continue to serve and rise higher in the organizational structure of Rotary International. Two years after his stellar performance as District Governor, PDG Mike faces yet a new challenge. In 2006 this Certified Public Accountant was asked to go to Rotary's headquarters in Evanston, Illinois where he trained for his new position: The Rotary Foundation's Humanitarian Grant Specialized Auditor (now called Cadre of Financial Auditors). He was the only Filipino amongst the 20 Rotarians appointed to the position worldwide, by TRF Chairman Luis Vicente Giay and he will hold this post until December 2008 (it was recently renewed till 2018). Mike was Cadre Technical Coordinator for Financial Audit and has served from July, 2009 until June, 2012. He served as Regional Foundation Alumni Coordinator for Zone 7A (Philippines and Indonesia) for 3 years ending in June 2013. He also served as District Rotary Foundation Chairman and District trainer for RID 3820 for 3 years.

He is currently on his 7th year as Assistant Regional Rotary Foundation Coordinator for Zone 7A, Philippines and Indonesia

In RY 2006-2007, RI has awarded him the Four Avenues of Service Award for Individual Rotarian and TRF gave him a Citation for Meritorious Service Award. No Rotarian from District 3820 has been given by both RI and TRF in one year. In 2015, TRF honoured him with the Distinguished Service to the Rotary Foundation, the highest recognition given to a Rotarian by the Rotary Foundation.
