

A challenge to clean the world's rivers

With the help of Vicente Paredes of the Rotary Club of San Pedro de Tlaquepaque, Mexico, who connected people and worked on logistics, the Rotary clubs of Ameca, Mexico, and of Rohnert Park-Cotati and South Ukiah, California, carried out the first Ameca River cleanup day in April 2014. They have since organized more cleanups of the river.

That project eventually expanded to become Cleaning the Rivers of the World, which has challenged Rotary clubs across the globe to clean up a river. The initiative has been adopted by the Water & Sanitation Rotarian Action Group as part of the Annual World Water Day Challenge, as well as by the Environmental Sustainability Rotarian Action Group. Rotarians have organized cleanup projects in Colombia, India, Nigeria, Peru, Turkey, and Venezuela, as well as in other parts of Mexico and the United States.

In 2018, Rico joined his fellow Rotarians in a project on the Lerma River. "As a kid, I always hoped that someday I could go home and do something to turn all the sewage into pristine waters," he says. "Now I can say, with a clear conscience, that I did everything I could to leave a better world for our kids."

Rotary Youth Exchange

Builds peace one young person at a time.

Students learn a new language, discover another culture, and truly become global citizens. Exchanges for students 15 to 19 years old are sponsored by Rotary clubs in more than 100 countries.

What are the benefits?

Exchange students unlock their true potential to:

- * Develop lifelong leadership skills
- * Learn a new language and culture
- * Build lasting friendships with young people from around the world
- * Become a global citizen

How long do exchanges last?

Long-term exchanges last a full academic year, and students attend local schools and live with multiple host families.

Short-term exchanges last from several days to three months and are often structured as camps, tours, or homestays that take place when school is not in session.

What are the costs?


Room and board are provided, as well as any school fees. Each program varies, but students are usually responsible for:

- * Round-trip airfare
- * Travel insurance
- * Travel documents (such as passports and visas)
- * Spending money and any additional travel or tours.

How can I apply?

Candidates are 15-19 years old and are leaders in their schools and communities. Contact your local Rotary club to see what exchange opportunities are available and what the application process involves.



How to cook Siomai

One of the products of Centro's livelihood project is pork siomai.

Pork Siomai is a traditional Chinese dump-

ling. This popular dumpling has made its way to the heart of the Filipino's as evidenced by the hundreds of stalls, eateries, and restaurants who serve them.

Ingredients

- 2 1/2 lbs ground pork
- 1 cup shrimp minced
- 2 cups water chestnuts minced
- 5 tbsp sesame oil
- 1 tbsp ground black pepper
- 1 cup onion minced
- 1 cup carrots minced
- 1 1/2 cups white mushroom minced
- 1 pack won ton wrapper
- 1/4 cup scallions minced
- 2 tsp salt
- 1 piece raw egg
- Water for steaming

Instructions

Combine all the ingredients except for the water and wanton wrapper and mix thoroughly.

Wrap the mixed ingredients using the won ton wrapper. (watch the video for easy procedure)

Using a steamer, steam the wrapped siomai (shaomai) for 15 to 25 minutes. The time depends on the size of each individual piece (larger size means more time steaming).

Serve hot with kikkoman soy sauce and calamansi or lemon dip. Share and enjoy!
