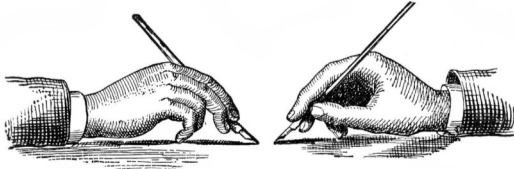

**Shekhar Mehta of India selected to be 2021-22 Rotary International President**

Shekhar Mehta, of the Rotary Club of Calcutta-Mahanagar, West Bengal, India, is the selection of the Nominating Committee for President of Rotary International for 2021-22. He will be declared the president-nominee on 1 October if no challenging candidates have been suggested.

Mehta acknowledges that current membership trends are a challenge and says that membership development should be Rotary's highest priority. He believes that focusing on regional plans, successfully transitioning Rotaractors into Rotary clubs, and increasing diversity and female members could yield a 5 percent net growth in membership each year.

"A major brainstorming is needed to find effective solutions suited to different areas of the world," says Mehta. He adds that regional ethos and culture have to be taken into account to find localized solutions, as "one size does not fit all." He believes Rotary can extend to new geographical areas and countries.

As a strong proponent of Rotary's strategic plan, Mehta says he will encourage clubs to use action plans and reinforce the core values of Rotary.

Mehta says Rotary needs to become more contemporary and adaptable by focusing on partnerships with governments and corporations, expanding partnerships with organizations that specialize in Rotary's areas of focus, and investing in technology.

Mehta, an accountant, is chair of the Skyline Group, a real estate development company he founded. He is also a director of Operation Eyesight Universal (India), a Canada-based organization.

Mehta has been actively involved in disaster response and is a trustee of ShelterBox, UK. After the 2004 Indian Ocean tsunami, he helped build nearly 500 homes for families affected by the disaster.

Mehta pioneered a program that has performed more than 1,500 life-changing heart surgeries in South Asia. He is also the architect of the TEACH Program, which promotes literacy throughout India and has reached thousands of schools.

A Rotary member since 1984, Mehta has served Rotary as director, member or chair of several committees, zone coordinator, training leader, member of The Rotary Foundation Cadre of Technical Advisers, and district governor. He is also the chair of Rotary Foundation (India).

Mehta has received Rotary's Service Above Self Award and The Rotary Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service and Distinguished Service Awards.

He and his wife, Rashi, are Major Donors and members of the Bequest Society.

## **RI Election Board Decision to D3820 Election Dispute for District Governor RY 2021-22**

### **To All Champion Presidents:**

Please be informed that our District has received the result of RI's decision concerning the election dispute for the 2021-22 District Governor. For your information, the same is hereunder quoted, to wit:

“DECISION: The Board, the Executive Committee acting on its behalf,

3. Receives the complaint of the Rotary Club of Pagsanjan concerning the election of the 2021-22 Governor of District 3820 (Philippines) and

- a. finds that the governor selection process was impacted by the governor's initial failure to follow the RI by-laws' requirements on submitting challenging candidates and inquiring whether any clubs wish to concur with the challenge;
- b. finds that the timeframe initially offered by the governor to submit challenges was inadequate;
- c. c. in accordance with RI by-laws section 14.020.9, directs the 2019-20 governor to inform the clubs of the name of the challenging candidate, set a deadline for concurrences 14 days later, and, if sufficient concurrences are received, proceed with a ballot between the candidate selected by the nominating committee and the challenging candidate to select the 2021-22 governor of the district.”

As you are aware, the district nominating committee has selected **Past President VICENTE “VIC” I. CANTOS** to be the governor of our district in Rotary Year 2021-22.

A challenge to this nomination has been received from the Rotary Club of Pagsanjan that submitted the name of **Past President ANGELITA “ANGIE” F. SUNIO** of the Rotary Club of Pagsanjan whose name was previously submitted to the district nominating committee.

For your reference, pertinent provisions of RI Bylaws are herewith quoted

**“Article 14.020.8. Challenging Candidates.** *Any club in the district which has been in existence for at least one year as of the beginning of that year may also propose a challenging candidate for governor-nominee provided this club has previously suggested such candidate to the nominating committee. A club in existence for less than one year as of the beginning of that year may propose a challenging candidate provided such candidate is a member of that club and the challenging candidate must have been duly suggested to the nominating committee. The name of the challenging candidate shall be submitted pursuant to a resolution by the club adopted at a regular meeting. The club must file the resolution with the governor by the date determined by the governor. Such date shall be not more than 14*

**14.020.9. Concurrence to Challenges.** *The governor shall inform all clubs through a form prescribed by RI of the name of any challenging candidate who has been proposed as specified above. The governor shall also inquire whether any club wishes to concur with the challenge. A club must file a resolution of the club adopted at a regular meeting to concur with a challenge. Such resolutions must be filed with the governor by the date determined by the governor. Only challenges that have been concurred to by at least 10 other clubs which have been in existence for at least one year as of the beginning of that year or 20 percent of the total number of clubs as at the beginning of that year in the district which have been in existence for at least one year as of the beginning of that year, whichever is higher, and only when such resolutions by the club were adopted at a regular meeting in accordance with the club bylaws as determined by the governor shall be considered valid. A club shall concur with only one challenging candidate. “*

Consequently, your club now has until **August 24, 2019** midnight to endorse the challenging candidate using the form at the bottom of this letter. If you do not wish to endorse the challenging candidate, then you do not need to do anything. Only challenges that have been concurred to by 20 percent of the total number of clubs in this district which have been in existence for at least one year as of the beginning of this Rotary Year 2019-20, and only when such resolutions by the club were adopted at a regular meeting in accordance with the club bylaws as determined by the governor shall be considered valid. If by the above date I have not received sufficient endorsements for the above challenge, the Rotarian selected by the nominating committee will be certified to RI as the nominee for our district.

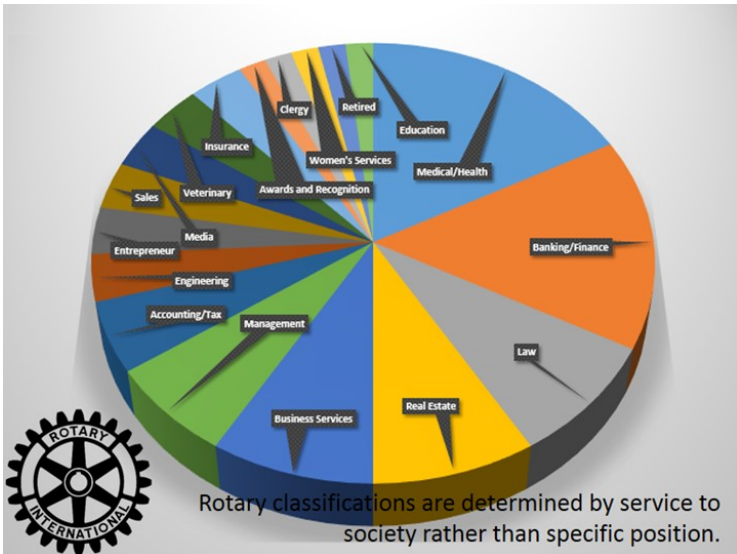


## ROTARY CORNER

### The Classification Principle of Rotary

Virtually all membership in Rotary is based upon a "classification." Basically a classification describes the distinct and recognized business or professional service that the Rotarian renders to society. The principle of Rotary classification is somewhat more specific and precise. In determining the classification of a Rotarian it is necessary to look at the "principal or recognized business or professional activity of the firm, company or institution" with which an active member is connected or "that which covers his principal and recognized business or professional activity."

It should be clearly understood that classifications are determined by activities or services to society rather than by the position held by a particular individual. In other words, if a person is the president of a bank, he or she is not classified as "bank president" but under the classification "banking."

Its construction first started in 1978 but due to a host of factors such as unpredictable weather and difficulty of navigating the river, the completion was delayed for more than 3 decades.

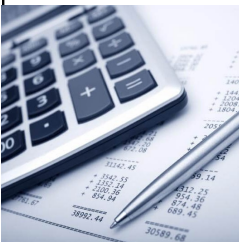
Aluling Bridge connects the provinces of Ilocos Sur and the Mountain Province.
