## President's Message

Dear Centronians,

There were numerous inductions from August to September and today, September 18, 2019, we are having ours. Though busy with the preparations for the induction, we managed to have two projects that I have included in our banner projects because of their impact. We hoped that we will be able to develop careers and eventually paved the path for a better future of the kids who are or will become beneficiaries of these projects.

One is the Norwegian Cadetship Scholarship Program. Though we had the same project in 2015 and produced two scholars who are now graduates of Maritime Engineering (one is a Magna Cum Laude!) , the club was not able to pursue the project annually. This year, we again partnered with Norwegian Training Center and helped them find their scholars. After the campaigns done in all public senior high schools in Santa Rosa City, the culminating activity of the project—the Scholarship Admissions test was held last September 7. A total of 100 students took the exam. RC Metro San Pedro teamed with us on this project. We hope and pray that a lot of these students will pass the exam and later on become graduates of Maritime Engineering/ Transportation. Kudos to our vocational chair PND Joseph Rey Alcala, who chaired the project.

Another project is the Musikabataan, Musikapayapaan. This is a music scholarship program that would encourage aspiring young musicians to hone their skills in playing violins for free. In this project, music is used as a therapy to address physical, emotional, cognitive, and social needs of individuals. Ten kids from Puting Kahoy Elementary School are the beneficiaries of this project. We were joined by RC Nuvali on this project and Rotarian Mark Adrian Gonzales were the kids' violin instructor.

We thank our partners and hopefully we get to have more projects that will shape the lives of our young.

Mark Daniel Maloney is a principal in the law firm of Blackburn, Maloney, and Schuppert LLC, with a focus on taxation, estate planning, and agricultural law. He represents large farming operations in the Southeastern and Midwestern United States, and has chaired the American Bar Association's Committee on Agriculture in the section of taxation. He is a member of the American Bar Association, Alabama State Bar Association, and the Alabama Law Institute.

He has been active in Decatur's religious community, chairing his church's finance council and a local Catholic school board. He has also served as president of the Community Foundation of Greater Decatur, chair of Morgan County Meals on Wheels, and director of the United Way of Morgan County and the Decatur-Morgan County Chamber of Commerce.

A Rotarian since 1980, Maloney has served as an RI director; Foundation trustee and vice chair; and aide to 2003-04 RI President Jonathan Majiyagbe. He also has participated in the Council on Legislation as chair, vice chair, parliamentarian, and trainer. He was an adviser to the 2004 Osaka Convention Committee and chaired the 2014 Sydney Convention Committee.

Prior to serving as a district governor, Maloney led a Group Study Exchange to Nigeria.

He also served as Future Vision Committee vice chair; Foundation training institute moderator; Foundation permanent fund national

adviser; member of the Peace Centers Committee; and adviser to the Foundation's Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene in Schools Target Challenge Committee.

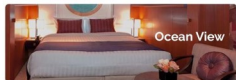

## Norwegian Cadetship Scholarship Project

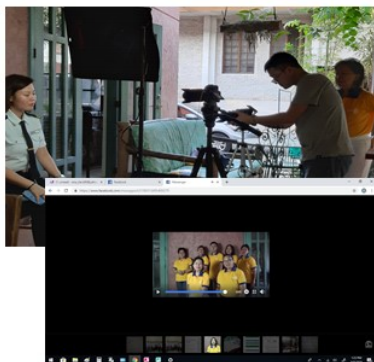

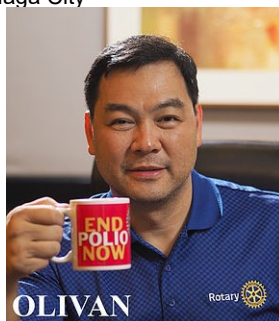

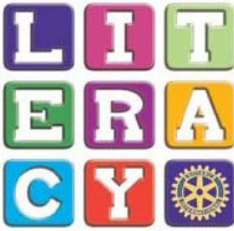

After retirement, she shifted her field of practice from IT to Real Estate. She took the Broker's Exam in 2013 and placed 9th over-all.

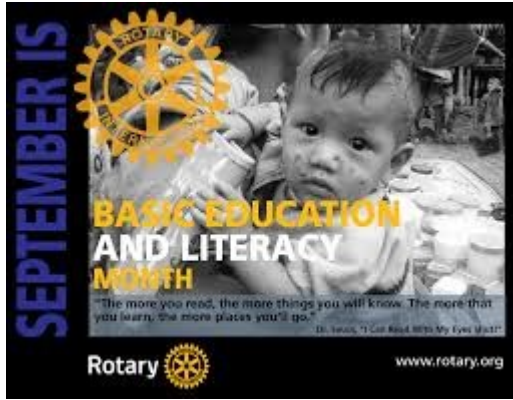
She now runs the family owned property leasing company, South-first Real Estate & Property Management .

In our Rotary calendar the month of September is Basic Education and Literacy. The Rotary Foundation supports education through scholarships, donations, and service projects around the world.

*Rotary members make amazing things happen, like:*

- Opening schools: In Afghanistan, Rotary members opened a girls' school to break the cycle of poverty and social imbalance.
- Teaching adults to read: Rotary members in the United States partnered with ProLiteracy Detroit to recruit and train tutors after a study showed that more than half of the local adult population was functionally illiterate.
- New teaching methods: The SOUNDS program in South Africa, Puerto Rico and the United States teaches educators how to improve literacy by teaching children to recognize letters by sounds instead of names.
- Making schools healthy: Rotarians are providing clean, fresh water to every public school in Lebanon so students can be healthier and get a better education.

5. Initial estimate for budget is 5k per club. Total budget  $5k \times 7 \text{ clubs} = 35k$
6. At any rate, total expenses (including truck rental expenses) shall be divided equally among the 7 clubs.
