It might have been my first but definitely would love to have to be part of one again as this is where you get to meet rotarians in the same zone as ours. Maraming Salamat for making me part of history.

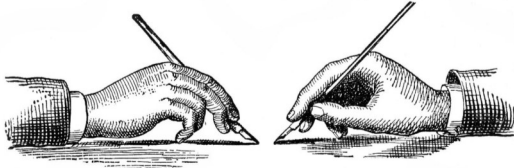

The Sustainability Challenge

10 years into the Rotary-USAID water and sanitation partnership, here's what worked, what didn't — and why

An old piece of railroad track is laid across a pit toilet. The walls are crumbling. The stench is overwhelming. It's the only toilet for a school in rural Ghana, and most children refuse to use it. They do their business outside instead — or quit school altogether.

This is an all-too-common experience: Half of Ghana's population lives in rural areas, and only 10 percent of those people have access to basic sanitation. Two-thirds can obtain safe drinking water — after a 30-minute round trip.

Since 2009, Rotary has been working to fix those deficiencies through a partnership with the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID). The partnership combines the business skills and local community leadership of Rotarian volunteers with the technical expertise of USAID. Rotary is contributing \$9 million to the \$18 million partnership; outside of eradicating polio, it is Rotary's largest partnership effort. "We wondered how these two organizations could come together and exploit the synergy between them," says Rotarian Ron Denham, a member of the Rotary-USAID steering committee.

Ghana was one of three pilot countries when the program kicked off. Projects were implemented in two phases: Phase 1 concluded in 2013, and Phase 2 will end in 2020. "As a result of this partnership, we've been able to reach out to some very deprived communities," says Emmanuel Odotei, WASH management specialist for USAID/Ghana. "If USAID had tried to do this alone, or if Rotary had done it alone, we would never have achieved as much as we have today."

Throughout, the focus of the program has been on accomplishing three goals: improving sanitation and hygiene in schools and health facilities; increasing community access to safe drinking water; and advocating for ample government financing of WASH — that is, water, sanitation, and hygiene.

Lessons learned

Don't forget the broader community and financial planning is crucial.

Improvements affect more than just the target school or village. Also, an income stream, through fees or levies, is essential to provide money for repairs. It is important to teach the local committee to establish an accounting system and put money in the bank.

Get government support early and invest in changing hygiene habits.

Cooperation from local government officials is essential for sustainability. Also, the partnership is about more than facilities. Teaching hand washing skills can have as great an effect as higher-priced interventions.

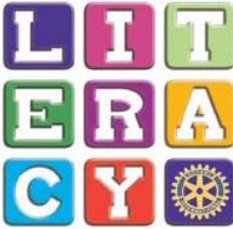
Make sure government stays involved and choose the technology that suits the local context.

Once government is involved, it is important to keep it involved so local committees are not left to manage complex facilities on their own. Also, the right technology is important. But if the community cannot advocate for its ongoing needs, unsanitary conditions can render the improvements useless.

Be prepared to work incrementally and keep communities accountable.

Some solutions have to be implemented in stages. In one Ghana community, a manual borehole led to a water storage tank and later solar panels. Also, local committees need ongoing consultation so they can learn to hold themselves accountable and make action plans to address any shortcomings.

Did You Know? A Sports Moment in Rotary History, Charles Buschmann

Before (Rotarian) Charles Buschmann was done — he died in 1964 at age 96, the oldest member of the city’s Rotary Club — he had won state medals in gymnastics, helped found the Indianapolis Athletic Club, carried a bowling average in the 170s into his 70s and was described in a 1947 newspaper story as “the Jim Thorpe of Indiana.”

Along the way he became business partners with Henry Severin, who built the Omni Severin in 1913. Charles Buschmann named his son after his business partner, and that son — Severin Buschmann Sr. — took the family into weird and wonderful directions.

Charles Buschmann lived and died before our era’s history book, the Internet. His snowball rolled on, gaining size, but then it went the other direction for such a sad reason: If you don’t exist online, you almost don’t exist. As memories faded and people died, Charles Buschmann nearly disappeared. Time and our reliance on technology did that, turning one of the most important figures in state history — sports, politics, more — into a name, a rumor, someone who may have done something a long time ago.

Business Man Once “Jim Thorpe” Of Indiana Sports

Charles L. Buschmann, president of Lewis Meier and Company, was a regular “Jim” among Indiana athletes 87-1892.

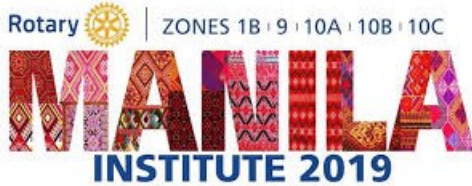

As the Champion District Governor of Rotary International District 3820, it is my privilege to invite you to submit suggestions for nomination for District Governor Nominee Designate (DGND) for RY 2022-2023 and Nominating Committee (NomCom) Member.

As per Article 12.030.3. 2019 Manual of Procedure

"The governor shall invite the clubs to submit their suggestions for nominations for governor. The deadline for suggestions is at least two months before the nominating committee meeting. The suggestions shall be submitted by a resolution naming the suggested candidate adopted at a regular club meeting and certified by the secretary. A club shall only suggest one of its own members.

Please pay attention to the qualifications of District Governor:

Article 16.010. Qualifications of a Governor-nominee.

Unless excused by the board, the person selected as a governor-nominee shall at the time of selection:

- (a) be a member in good standing of a functioning club in the district;
- (b) have served as club president for a full term or as charter president for at least six months;
- (c) demonstrate willingness, commitment, and ability to fulfill the duties and responsibilities of a governor in section 16.030;
- (d) demonstrate knowledge of the qualifications, duties and responsibilities of governor as prescribed in the bylaws; and
- (e) submit to RI a statement that the Rotarian understands those qualifications, duties, and responsibilities, is qualified for the office of governor, and is willing and able to assume and faithfully perform those duties and responsibilities.

Article 16.020. Qualifications of a Governor. Unless excused by the board, a governor, when taking office, must have attended the international assembly for its full duration, have been a Rotarian for at least seven years, and continue to possess the qualifications in section 16.010.

Only Past Presidents who have served one full term and have been members in good standing of a club for seven consecutive years are eligible for nomination as NomCom member.

In order to nominate a qualified Rotarian, please observe the following REQUIREMENTS:
FOR DGND:

- Complete resume with candidate statement and signature.
- Must submit (50) fifty sets of resume.
- A photo of the candidate and family.
- Certification of good mental and physical health by a doctor, preferably a Rotarian.

RI District 3820 News & Updates

FOR NOMCOM MEMBER:(District TOR 2019)

- No Rotarian can serve two consecutive terms as NOMCOM Chair or member.
- Clubs are entitled to one candidate for every 25 members or major fraction thereof. It may do so by filing with the District Governor a Board or Club Resolution in a form prescribed and furnished by the District Governor which shall contain name of the proposed candidate and the period he/she served as President which must be received by the Office of the District Governor no later than January 15.

In this connection, please submit your suggestions for nomination for District Governor Nominee and Nominating Committee Member to District Governor Everett Uy Olivan via Registered Mail or any courier services located at Champion District 3820 Office/RCSO, Lemon Residences, Magsaysay Avenue, Naga City 4400. Submission of the Candidate's Resume and Club Resolution for candidate of Nominating Committee will commence today November 16, 2019 and will terminate on January 15, 2020 and must be received at the Rotary Club Support Office (RCSO) within the date and time specified. Submission of resume and Club Resolution can be either by mail or hand carried. If by mail, the sender should ensure that it will be received by the RCSO Secretariat on or before 5:00 o'clock p.m of January 15, 2020; If hand carried, it should be duly received and acknowledged by the Champion Rotary Club Support Office (RCSO) Secretary on or before 5:00 pm of January 15, 2020.

The District Selection Committee headed by PDG Jose Pepito "Pete" Tenorio, Jr. will convene on January 16, 2020 to review / evaluate the resumes and club resolutions submitted by the Candidates and clubs for proper screening.

The Governor's office shall also announce the names of the candidates who have qualified for DGND selection.

On January 18, 2020 at Lima Park Hotel, Malvar - Lipa Batangas

- All candidates as well as those nominated for NomCom membership must be present

>Briefing/Orientation for the Nominees of NomCom

>The appointed NOMCOM Chairman together with the District Governor shall draw from the boxes of each area wherein the names of the nomcom nominees submitted by the clubs are placed. Announcement of the chosen NOMCOM members shall be made thereafter.

>Selected Nominating Committee will convene

> DGND candidates will be presented before the nominating committee, after which the Nominating Committee will begin to select the DGND based on its evaluation using the terms of reference.
