Hopefully, as this pandemic goes on, people will realize that helping does not only mean the physical help (“ayuda”) but also help prevent the stigma from being a COVID patient.

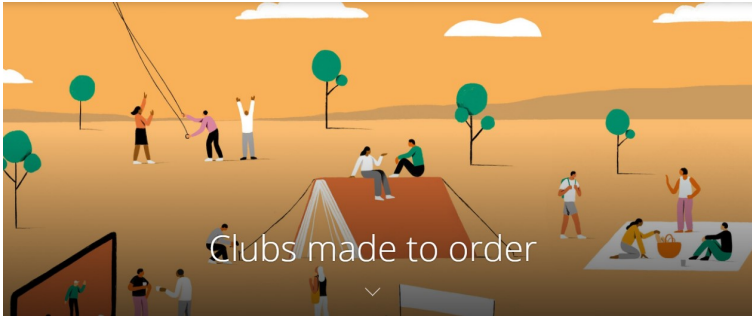

News & Updates**Chesley R. Perry: Rotary's first general secretary**

Chesley Reynolds Perry, a Spanish-American War veteran and former Chicago Public Library employee, served as Rotary's first secretary and is known as "the builder of Rotary International."

While Rotary's president changes every year, only 12 people have served as general secretary, a role that's equivalent to a chief executive — and at 32 years, Perry served the longest.

In August 1910, the newly formed National Association of Rotary Clubs (now Rotary International) unanimously selected Perry for the role then known as secretary. He accepted the part-time position at \$100 per month, with an agreement that the amount of time he'd devote would remain unspecified. By 1912, the job had evolved into a full-time executive role, and Perry's pay was increased.

Perry's own office on LaSalle Street in Chicago, Illinois, USA, served as the first headquarters of the association. By 1911, Rotary had established an office in the First National Bank Building at the intersection of Dearborn and Monroe in Chicago.

Perry concurrently served as editor and business manager of The Rotarian from 1911 to 1928, and he opened Rotary's first international office, in Zurich, Switzerland, in February 1925. He oversaw the expansion of Rotary as it grew during his tenure from 16 clubs in the United States to more than 5,000 worldwide. His title was officially changed to general secretary in 1941-42, his final year in office.

Perry had announced his plans to retire in 1940, but agreed to remain in his post while the organization trained his successor, Philip C. Lovejoy. A number of clubs sought to nominate Perry for RI president in 1942-43, but he declined, saying, "I am gratefully conscious of the high compliment thereby being paid to me."

After retiring, Perry remained a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago, which he'd joined in 1908. But he wasn't done being a leader, and served as club president in 1944-45. In 1954, Rotary offered

him the title "secretary emeritus" to honor his years of service, but he again declined, preferring the role of ordinary Rotarian.

Perry died on 21 February 1960 at the age of 87.

The Challenges of Implementing the Quarantine (Ang Pasaway na Pinoy)

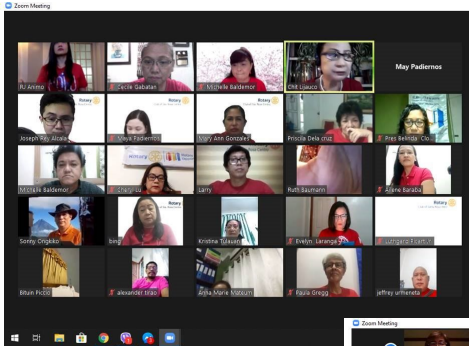

The meeting was called to order by Transforming President Belinda Barroga at 6:15PM.

The master of ceremony was CP/PDG Chit Lijauco.

Invocation was lead by PP Liza Pineda, followed by the National Anthem, The 4 Way-Test by Rtn. Star Piccio, and Object of Rotary by Rtn. Larry Gonzales. The House Rules were read by PP Ma-Ann Gonzales and Acknowledgement of Guests by IPP Cecile Gabatan

President Belinda Barroga welcomed the club members and all participants. She said that this event, entitled "Challenges in Implementing Quarantine," is one of the Areas of Focus of Rotary International - Peace and Conflict Prevention/Resolution - and that this will give the club members and participants the guidelines on how to follow the law during quarantine and live through the challenges of the new normal.

The master of ceremony CP/PDG Chit Lijauco welcomed the speaker and read the Introduction of the Speaker of PP/Mayor Arlene Arcillas who happened to be unable to attend due to her various meetings.

Minutes of the Meeting

TALK OF PNP CHIEF GENERAL ARCHIE GAMBOA

PNP Chief General Archie Gamboa, coming from his sister's induction as the Transforming President, greeted the club and other guests a pleasant evening. He said that peace has always been one of Rotary's goals since it was founded and that peace in communities can have a global effect and can even unite different religions and cultures. He said that the search for national peace has been a lifelong goal for Filipinos - that the country's struggle for freedom and democracy costs lives and property, but on the positive side has given strength and clarity of vision.

He affirmed that the PNP, being the primary agency of enforcing the law, prevent and control crimes, maintain peace and order, and ensure public safety, with the active help of the community, have done great in maintaining that goal by making a stance against illegal activities, crimes, and terrorism. He continued on saying, "our community based policing has continuously harboured results against crime through citizens' vanguard of their respective communities." They do it so that mothers can sleep sound at night knowing that their kids can play freely without fearing for their lives.

He talked about the terrorism going on in the country for almost 40 years. He said that the PNP and AFP, through the President's whole nation approach, have diagnosed the center of their resources. Furthermore, communist parties have been resilient throughout the years because of their wide area operations wherein they get supported and financed, thinking that organizing the oppressed class is the key to moving the communist revolution forward. Hence, he warned people in the business sector to be vigilant with the scheming of these groups and strongly suggested Rotarians to continuously harness and strengthen their community-based projects especially on the youth and offer more livelihood projects for less fortunate citizens. He believes that it is not only the responsibility of the national leaders to establish peace and that every individual's contribution is a vital factor in maintaining and achieving peace. He gave a quote from Thomas Jefferson, "Educate and inform the whole mass of the people. Enable them to see that it is their interest to preserve peace and order and they will preserve them."

He ended his speech informing about the PNP's role in quarantine protocols and that despite getting bashed by some people with the course of implementation, he told his policemen to exercise maximum tolerance because at the end of the day the PNP is at the frontline in implementing the quarantine rules. Lastly, he shared how hard it was since the Taal volcano eruption continuing to the lockdown but is hopeful that country will be able to overcome this pandemic as one.

Minutes of the Meeting

QUESTION AND ANSWER

CP/PDG Chit Lijauco guided the participants in the question and answer. The following were some of the questions:

Q1. How did you become a Rotarian?

A1. My wife was invited in Rotary and she encourage me to also join Rotary. It is a privilege to be a member of Rotary. I have been an officer in the PNP for more than 36 years now. What I love most in Rotary and am proud of, which I always share to PNP, in Rotary, three years before you assume as president of the club, you can prepare because they have a President Nominee, President Elect and we have current officers. Every year they develop a theme and a strategic action plan. But in government you cannot do that because if the tenure of office we occupy has a different thrust in leadership, the strategic plan changes also. But what interested me most is when you give into Paul Harris it will get back to you a hundred fold.

Q2. Is wearing a mask mandatory even if you're alone inside the car?

A2. Definitely it's a must even you are alone and inside the car. It is automatic to wear a mask the moment you go out of your house. It is our responsibility to take precautions for our safety and the community.

Q3. What are your preparations to protect your people?

A3. For the protection of our people, we make sure that they have the complete necessary protection like face mask, PPE, face shield, and the regular swab test. We do isolation facilities exclusively for the PNP.


VOTE OF THANKS
